

**EARLY MORNING ACADEMICS & RECREATION  
REGISTRATION FORM**

The New School offers supervised academics (studying or doing homework in the media center) and/or recreation (relaxed, social time in the gym) before school each day from 7:30-8:30 AM throughout the school year.

The cost is \$585 per semester, billed on a semester basis and payable in advance. Payment is non-refundable, even if your child drops out during the semester. No refunds will be made for absences, and we will not prorate payment if your child attends fewer than five days a week. A late fee of 1.5% per month (minimum of \$25.00) will be applied to any bill that is unpaid after 30 days.

Early morning study time can be a huge help for students who have trouble getting work done at home and are willing to use this time productively. Students can also opt to stretch their muscles, shoot baskets or socialize in the gym.

Students are expected to abide by all the rules in the student handbook, or risk being dropped from the program with no money refunded.

The school does not provide transportation to school from the Metro earlier than 8:30 AM.

If you would like to enroll your child in Early Morning Academics & Recreation for the first semester, simply complete this form and submit it to the school as soon as possible with your first semester payment of \$585.
